<p><u>Resident:</u> A Vermont resident is anyone that lives more than six months a year in Vermont, receives their mail in Vermont and holds a valid Vermont driver's license. A resident must present a valid copy of their Vermont Resident snowmobile registration to show proof of registration and ownership in order to buy a Resident TMA.</p>	<p><u>Non-Resident Property Owner</u> A non-resident who owns property and pays Vermont Property Tax in Vermont is eligible to purchase a Resident TMA for snowmobiles owned and registered in their names. Prior to issuing a resident decal, they must provide the following: Copy of their current Vermont tax bill. Copy of their current Vermont snowmobile registration.</p>	<p><u>Non-Resident</u> Anyone that is not a resident of Vermont or a Vermont resident that elects to register their snowmobile in another state, not Vermont, must purchase a Non-Resident TMA. The following must be provided: Valid copy of their current snowmobile registration, state or provincial, or, Valid copy of a Non-Resident Vermont snowmobile registration.</p>
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As of September 01, 2003, every individual operating a snowmobile in Vermont is required to have Personal Liability Insurance. The minimum required coverage is \$25,000 for one injury or \$50,000 for two or more injuries or deaths with a minimum of \$10,000 property damage. **(The fine for operating without insurance is costly!)**

Proof of insurance is NOT required to buy your TMA.
